QWB ineffective works signs unnecessarily obstructing Margaret St footpath

Hello QWB

This email seeks your action on the multiple temporary traffic warning signs being placed daily on the Margaret St footpath between George St and William St by personnel working on the Queens Wharf project.

These signs are understood to be intended to warn motorists of what appears to be a temporary loading zone around to the left in George St.

As you can see from the first two of the attached images I have taken of these signs they are obstructing a very busy footpath on the right hand side (when travelling in the direction of the motorised traffic) of Margaret St.

However, these provide no actual safety notice to the motorists being targeted by these signs, as they are travelling in the lane on the opposite (left hand) side of Margaret St, who are unlikely to even be able to see these signs because other traffic blocks their vision in this direction.

As indicated in my attached 3rd and 4th images, there is plenty of room for these signs to be placed on the footpath on the other side of Margaret St, which is currently closed to pedestrians and cyclists etc and hence will not obstruct this traffic. Furthermore, the other side of Margaret St is where the motorists who need to see these messages are travelling.

I look forward to your response on this issue.
